ENGLISH PLACEMENT

ACT of 17 (English) or below, SAT 449 (verbal) or below, 37 or below on ASSET exam
 – English 90

ACT 18-24, SAT 450 or above, 38 on writing skills of ASSET
 – English 101

ACT 25 or above may take a proficiency exam for Eng 102 Please refer to the English Department (A-305) for any other assistance.

MATH PLACEMENT

ACT 18 or below, SAT below 460
 – Math 090, followed by Math 091 (Students may take a Math Placement Test to qualify for Math 091 rather than Math 090)

ACT 19-21, SAT 460-500
 – MATH 101
 – MATH 201 (maybe OK)
 – Math 103 not advised

ACT 22-27, SAT 510- 620
 – *Math 103, Math 105 or Math 201

**Math 103R is mandatory for students who scored less than 23 on the Math portion of the ACT or less than 540 on the Math portion of the SAT.*

ACT 28 and above, SAT 630 and above
 – Math 250 Please refer to the Math Department (S-200) for any other assistance.
