**MATH PLACEMENT**

Students may not enroll in a mathematics course for credit towards graduation unless a minimum score of 19 is earned on the mathematics section of the Enhanced ACT test, or a minimum score of 460 on the quantitative portion of the Re-centered SAT. Students not meeting these minimal requirements must successfully complete the developmental program consisting of MATH 90 and/or MATH 91 with a C or higher. Students will be allowed to register for mathematics courses based on ACT/ SAT mathematics scores.
