
Q8 - What is your current overall GPA?





Q10 - While at Concord were you a resident, commuter, or both?




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Q11 - What was your residence at time of admission to Concord University?





Concord University.




Q14 - During this last year of study, approximately how many hours per week do you spend working while attending class?
