ARTICULATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN CONCORD COLLEGE AND THE MONROE COUNTY BOARD OF ED.

This agreement is entered into between Concord College and the Monroe County Board of Education, both public educational institutions operating within the State of West Virginia.

- I. Terms of Agreement
 The agreement, upon affixation of the appointed signatures from both institutions (namely the President and Academic Vice President from Concord College and the Superintendent and Vocational Director for Monroe County) shall remain in effect until revised or terminated as outlined in Section III.
- Nature of Articulation
 Upon admission to Concord College and completion of thirty (30) semester hours with a minimum GAP of 2.0, college credit may be awarded for successful completion of approved secondary/post-secondary vocational technical courses from the Monroe County Vocational Technical Center. Evaluation of the student's training and competency will be made by a committee of faculty members from the Division of Business and Economics at Concord College. Students may receive up to fifteen (15) semester hours credit. At the discretion of the committee, a competency examination may be required.

The division of Business and Economics may also teach courses at the Monroe County Vocational Technical Center at times agreed upon by both schools involved. The courses will be lower-division, college-level business administration courses.

A committee of faculty members from the Division of Business and Economics at Concord College and a representative from the Monroe County Vocational Technical Center will annually evaluate the secondary/post-secondary programs at the Vocational Center.

Either party to this agreement may request meetings to discuss revisions or additions to the program. These requests shall be acted upon in a timely manner.

Revision or Termination
This agreement shall remain in effect until specifically revised or terminated. Either party to the agreement may, upon a minimum of thirty (30) days written notice, terminate the agreement effective at the end of the fiscal year. However, this program shall remain in effect until completion for any student who is enrolled at the Vocational Center during the agreement period.
