Helpful Hints

RNs interested in completing the BSN program must:

- Hold a valid RN license,
- Submitted a formal application to the BSN program,
- College Algebra with a grade of "C" or better,
- Statistics with a grade of "C" or better,
- 120 Credit hours required to graduate with at least a 3.0 GPA,
- Completed a 4-hour general biology and 4-hour general chemistry course with lab with a grade of "C" or better,
- 8 hours of anatomy and physiology with labs and grades of "C" or better,
- Earned an Associate's Degree in Nursing,
- Courses from the traditional Nursing Program are encouraged to fulfill elective requirements.
