Helpful Hints

- A grade of C is recommended for all 300 and 400 level English courses, but if you are planning to go to graduate school, A's and B's are necessary.
- Semester 6 Landmark—If considering graduate school, you should start focusing on narrowing choices, taking the GRE, and preparing writing samples. You may want to consider being a TA for a lower level class for experience. Take ENGL 472: Professional Paths in the Humanities this semester as your capstone.
- Semester 7 Landmark—If going to graduate school, start asking faculty members for recommendation letters.
- Semester 8 Landmark—This semester you will take your Capstone Exam and prepare and submit your assessment portfolio. For more details see your advisor.
- Semester 8 Capstone — If ENGL 472 was not taken in semester 6, either ENGL 451: Professional Writing Capstone or 461: Creative Writing Portfolio must be taken this semester. A student may take more than one of the capstone choices.
