Regional Education Leaders Making Big Plans for 24-25 School Year

Athens, W.Va. - Members of the GEAR UP Southern West Virginia (GEAR UP SWV) Regional Advisory Council (RAC) are planning ways to help students graduate from high school and continue their education. The GEAR UP SWV (RAC) will meet at Concord University in Athens, WV on Thursday, April 18 to develop plans for the 24-25 school year. The day will help GEAR UP SWV partners determine how to support students and families in the next school year. Partners represented at the meeting include Mercer, Monroe, Summers, Raleigh and Wyoming Counties, New River CTC and Concord University. The 24-25 school year will be the third year for the GEAR UP SWV federally funded project. The new school year holds special challenges as GEAR UP SWV students will be in both middle school and high school attending 8th and 9th grades. Partners will brainstorm to create a plan to meet six goals during the upcoming school year.

GEAR UP SWV 24-25 School Year Goals/Objectives

- The percentage of students completing Algebra 1 by the end of the 9th grade will increase by 5% in 24-25 and 25-26 school years.
- The average daily attendance rate will increase.
- Teachers will have higher expectations of GEAR UP SWV students and believe more students will enroll in postsecondary education.
- Students and their families know more about postsecondary education.
- GEAR UP SWV students will build even more resiliency.
- Schools in Mercer, Monroe, Summers, Raleigh and Wyoming Counties will increase their college-going culture.
