GEAR UP SWV Schools and Districts Celebrate National GEAR UP Week 2024

Athens, W.Va. – Thirty-one schools in five school districts are gearing up to celebrate National GEAR UP Week from September 23 through September 27, 2024. This week-long celebration commemorates the ongoing success of Gaining Early Awareness and Readiness for Undergraduate Programs (GEAR UP), a national initiative designed to provide students and their families with the support, resources, and tools needed for education after high school access and success.

GEAR UP Southern West Virginia (GEAR UP SWV), which currently serves over 3,800 stidents across Mercer, Raleigh, Summers, Wyoming, and Monroe Counties, has planned various activities to engage students, parents, and the community. This year, National GEAR UP Week kicked off early with the distribution of yard signs that read "I HEART GEAR UP SWV," proudly displayed at participating schools and supporting locations. To make this year's celebration even more impactful, GEAR UP SWV has introduced a National GEAR UP Week Road Map for schools to help unify efforts across all participating schools. The 2024 roadmap includes milestones such as poster contests, school events, and themed dress up days that encourage students to think about their future college and career paths.
