## **Minutes for meeting held Wednesday, October 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2025**

- Only one meal swipe a day can be used at Subway and/or Food Lab; this reduces flexibility for how meal plans can be used
- Health Center hours need to be extended so that it doesn't close at 2 PM; it was reported that the urgent care in Princeton will not accept walk-ins as advertised
- Parking space for the Health Center needs to be moved from behind the Fine Arts Building to closer to Rahall since the center is no longer in Wooddell
- Some of the doors to get into the Fine Arts Building have been locked during the daytime
- The Science Building is very cold; HVAC upgrades are supposed to be finished over Thanksgiving
