Any examination for which this schedule does not provide, or any departure from it, must be approved in advance by the Provost on the request of the instructor made through the Department Chair and College Dean. Please note that the final exam period is considered when calculating the Carnegie credit hours listed for each course, the observance of which is a requirement of our HLC accreditation; therefore, each course should be able in some way to account for the appropriate time allotted. Final Projects or alternative exams, such as take-home exams, are acceptable, as long as they are approved in advance. Faculty members should also carefully note the deadlines for submission of grades.
