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Things You Should Know!!!

Students leaving for the summer - dorm closing dates; refunds; next year room reservations

Course Registration - students who did not pre-register for the Summer or Fall semesters can still do so.

Students should contact their academic advisors or the Registrar's Office. The course schedule (and class sections with open and closed seats) can be accessed via http://cc.concord.edu

Financial Planning: - Concord recognizes that in these difficult economic times it is even more crucial to plan for your student's college expenses. Concord has taken numerous proactive steps to help students and parents prepare to meet college costs, including the following:

Financial Fridays - Throughout April and May Concord staff have extended hours - 7:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. - to meet with students to answer student questions and assist with outstanding balances, financial aid questions, and form completion.

Payment Plans - Concord now offers the option to enroll in a monthly installment payment plan. Students and parents can make monthly payment for tuition, fees, room, and board. A new application must be submitted every semester and the first month's installment must be made prior to the beginning of each semester. The initial installment must be equal to or greater than 25% of the outstanding balance. Please contact the Business Office for further information or to enroll:

Ellie Notification - Students are now able to check the status of their account, financial aid, grades, and other pertinent information by accessing their Ellie accounts. Students are notified via Ellie of outstanding financial aid requirements - such as paperwork and verification documents - that must be submitted to Financial Aid.

On-line Forms - Students and parents can now download Financial Aid Forms from the Concord website, http://www.concord.edu then click on **Prospective Students** or **Current Students** and then on **Financial Aid**. Every Concord student who receives Financial Aid must complete a Financial Aid Data Sheet. Other forms are for students/parents selected for **Verification**. (Students selected for verification will be notified via mail and Ellie, but students should check with the Financial Aid Office to be certain that their paperwork is complete.) Completed forms can be hand-delivered to Financial Aid, mailed, emailed, or faxed. The fax number is (304) 384-3084.

Early Award Letters - Concord has implemented new procedures to reduce the amount of time required to notify students of estimated awards. The benefit is that students and parents will know sooner how much to expect in financial aid for the coming year. Aid applicants must realize that actual awards are subject to Change, based on additional information received, federal and state program allocations, students' academic progress, outside scholarships, and the like.



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- Student Grades Concord no longer mails semester grades to students. Course grades are available electronically through your student's Ellie account. Final grades are available approximately one week after the end of the semester, so your student should check for his/her grades after Commencement, which is on Saturday, May 16th. Please note that according to federal FERPA Regulations (Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act), Concord Cannot release a student's grades to anyone other than the student, including parents. However, there is no law prohibiting students to discuss their grades with you!
- May / August Graduation To avoid overcrowding and assure a positive experience for students and their families, Concord will have two Commencement ceremonies for graduates on Saturday, May 16, 2009. The following schedule is in effect for Commencement 2009:
 - 10:00 a.m. Ceremony students with degrees conferred from the Divisions of Business, Education and Human Performance (including all Masters degrees), and Fine Arts.
 - 2:00 p.m. Ceremony students with degrees conferred from the Divisions of Languages and Literature, Natural Sciences, Social Sciences, Interdisciplinary Studies, and Regents Bachelor of Arts.
- Satisfactory Academic Progress Please be sure that your students review the policies regarding Satisfactory Academic Progress, including the specific requirements for financial aid recipients. These policies can be found in the Concord University Academic Catalog, which is also available online at the Concord University web site: www.concord.edu/academics.

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Alumni Banquet Slated for Friday, May 15

Concord will host its annual Alumni Banquet Friday, May 15 in the Jerry L. Beasley Student Center. The reception will begin at 5:30 p.m. in the Alumni Lounge on the third floor and the banquet will begin at 6 p.m. in the ballroom. Concord University Head Football Coach, Mike Keller, will be the guest speaker.

Kellar began as head football coach at Concord in December 2008, following a successful five-season stint as offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach at California University of Pennsylvania. The Vulcans reached the NCAA Division II national semi-finals in 2007 and 2008. They won or shared the Championship of the competitive Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference Western Division the last four seasons. The Vulcans compiled a record of 41-8 in that time. A native of Shinnston, West Virginia, Kellar is familiar with the West Virginia Intercollegiate Athletic Conference. He was the starting quarterback for both Glenville State College and Fairmont State College in the early 1990s. He began his coaching career at FSC in 1994.

The Alumni Association will be honoring Gregory M. Allen '70, William "Bill" Baker '62 and Nell Kessinger Jeffries '53.

Gregory Allen, recently elected as chair of the Concord University Foundation, was chosen as Concord's Outstanding Alumnus of the Year. To qualify for this award, one must be an alumnus of Concord University and have made "outstanding" accomplishments in one's professional and civic life. Allen graduated from Concord in 1970 with a B.S. in business administration and a concentration in economics. Since then, he has served in various management positions with Merrill Lynch, Morgan Stanley and Bank of America. In addition to his professional responsibilities, he has been active in the New Mexico Air National Guard, Texas National Guard, and Oklahoma National Guard. He was honored by the Oklahoma National Guard and Texas National Guard for outstanding service. Allen's resume also includes adjunct teaching for the University of New Mexico and Oklahoma City University.

William Baker was chosen as Concord's Golden Alumnus of the Year. To qualify for this award, one must be an alumnus of Concord University, contribute one's time and talents to Concord and the Alumni Association and have no fewer than 25 years of service to the University community. Baker graduated from Concord in 1962 and began his career as a math teacher and coach at Collins High School in Oak Hill. He served as assistant superintendent for Wood County schools and superintendent for both Raleigh and Mercer county schools. He served on the Raleigh County Commission, and was appointed by the governor to the state's Economic Development Grant Committee. He was awarded the Beckley-Raleigh Chamber of Commerce's 2005 Community Service Award. He was awarded the "President's Award for Service to Others" by Concord President Jerry Beasley in 2008.

Nell Jeffries was chosen as Concord's Alumnus of the year. To qualify for this award, one must be an alumnus of Concord University, a member of the Alumni Association and contribute one's time and talents to the university and Alumni Association. Graduating from Concord in 1953, Jeffries has worked as a member of the Athens Order of the Eastern Star, is a member of the Pine Trees Chapter of the Concord University Alumni Association and a lifetime member of the Alpha Sigma Tau Sorority. She was inducted in the PikeView Hall of Fame in 1995 and taught secondary school for 36 years.
